What will we be doing?

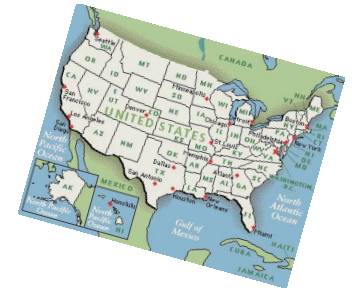
We will be taking a close look at the American Civil War that occurred 150 years ago! We will cook traditional food that soldiers ate, learn about the war, and create our own projects to take home! Each of these activities tie in with our upcoming exhibition, *From the Kennebunks to Appomattox: The Civil War at Home and Away*.

You'll jump into your day of activities by getting into the kitchen! Here, you will help to cook two historic Civil War foods. Johnnie cakes and hardtack were eaten by soldiers in the Union and Confederate Armies during the war. Each food is bread-based, which was easy to make and carry on the go.



Next, you will have the chance to discover more about soldiers' uniforms, weapons, and responsibilities. You'll then have the opportunity to create your own clothespin soldiers!

Then, it's time to try your hand at troop movements and signals. Would you know how to send a secret message during the Civil War? Soldiers had to know how to use codes and signal flags to send messages during the war. Learn more about troop movements using a large-scale map of the battleground.



At the end of the day, your projects will be placed on view for everyone to enjoy. Best of all, you'll get to take home everything you made as mementos of the day!
