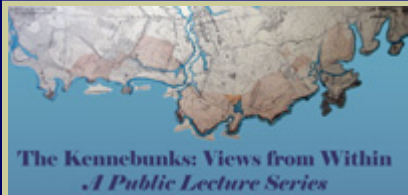

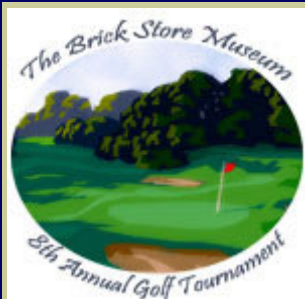

Travel with Us to Cape Cod's Oldest Village!

Bring your camera and your friends, and let *us* do the driving! Come along on our springtime cultural excursion to several destination attractions in Sandwich, Massachusetts-Cape Cod's oldest village- on Wednesday, June 8. The cost is \$75 for members of either [The Brick Store Museum](#) or the [Seacoast Garden Club](#) and \$85 for non-members. This day-trip package includes motorcoach transportation, snacks en route, admission fees and lunch.

The morning begins at the [Sandwich Glass Museum & Glassworks](#). See how early American glassmaking made Sandwich an industrial powerhouse in the mid 1800s, then watch a highly-skilled glass blower give a live demonstration of his craft. The museum's shop offers traditional reproductions and studio glass. Lunch has been specially arranged at [The Dunbar Tea Room](#) overlooking scenic Shawme Pond. En route to the day's final venue, drive through the charming downtown and past the Dexter Grist Mill, Thorton W. Burgess Museum, Hoxie House and several stately historic homes. The afternoon is spent at [Heritage Museum & Gardens](#) amid 100 acres of gardens and fine museums. The trip is timed to coincide with the famed bloom of thousands of Dexter rhododendrons. Highlights include the beautifully landscaped gardens, a 200-year-old windmill, one of the world's best displays of antique American automobiles, the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame, a display of military miniatures and antique firearms, folk art and Early American pieces, and a ride on a hand-carved 1912 carousel.

Renowned Author to Visit Museum

Join us for an evening with Harlow Giles Unger, author of numerous award-winning books, including historical biographies of Lafayette, John Hancock and Noah Webster. A veteran journalist, Unger was an editor with the *New York Herald Tribune* Overseas News Service and a foreign correspondent for the *Times* and the *Sunday Times* (London). Mr. Unger will enrich our understanding of Lafayette's role in the American Revolution and speak on the little-known subject of the French attempt to scuttle our newborn Nation. Special artifacts from the Museum's collections, relating to Lafayette's 1825 visit to Kennebunk, will be on view that evening, and Mr. Unger will be autographing copies of two of his books, available for purchase at the Museum.

Fees for the lecture are \$7 for the general public and \$5 for members of The Brick Store Museum. Books are \$17.95 plus tax for *Lafayette* (paperback) and \$27.95 plus tax for Harlow Unger's newly-released publication, *The French War Against America* (hardcover). Payment is by cash or check, with a 10% discount on these publications for Museum [members](#) (and an additional 5% discount when using the coupon below). Refreshments will follow the speaking program. While tickets will be available at the door, advance reservations are strongly recommended.
