Folder Breakdown:

The collection is in 30 folders as follows:

- Folder 1: A collection of papers relating to the ship *Atahualpa*, by Ralph Haskins for the years 1800, 1801, 1802 and 1803; Dixie Wildes commander
- Folder 2: A Bill of Sale for the schooner *Kennebunk* by the owner Burton M. M. Moody of Calais to Charles Ward of Kennebunk, dated December 31, 1918
- Folder 3: A letter from Henry B. Squires of Long Island to the Brick Store Museum, dated February 18, 1946 requesting a copy of the book, *Old Ship Portraits of Kennebunk*, and any information on the schooners *Louis V. Place* and *John R. Bergen* which were both commanded by his father at some time

- A receipt for Pew No. 35 on the upper floor of the Meeting House on the First Parish in the town of Wells in the name of William Eaton dated September 16, 1839, signed by John Rankin, parish Clerk (acq # 1460)
- An insurance policy of the Wells Mutual Fire Insurance Company for William Eaton dated February 11, 1845 (acq # 1460)
- A letter to William Eaton dated August 30, 1843 from Samuel Butland (?) regarding the death of his wife (acq # 1460)
- U.S. Claim Agency, Washington, 1853, regarding pensions (acq # 1460)
- A blank form regarding pensions and power of attorney for Samuel M. Knight
- A letter from S.M. Knight regarding an increase in pension paid to Abigail Eaton, dated March 28, 1855 (acq # 1460)
- Folder 14: A list of births in the Jacobs family, written by Abigail Jacobs, from 1787 – 1821 (acq # 1460)
- 1, A letter to Mr. John Butland of the U.S. brig *Enterprise* in Portsmouth, dated December 1813, from Joshua Jacobs (acq # 1460)
- A receipt for tax dated 14, Sept, 1814 paid by Mrs. Jacobs (acq # 1460)

A note stating, “For the British Legation – 2 copies of document marked Ex. Doc. No. 100 and 2 copies of Ex. Doc. No. 109 relative to Lobos Islands and relative to the Fisheries,” dated September 22, 1852.

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
