**FLANNEL AND BLAZE DAYS REPRESENT LAST CHANCE TO VIEW MAINE CAMP
EXHIBITION AT BRICK STORE MUSEUM**

KENNEBUNK, MAINE – With the Brick Store Museum’s popular exhibition *Camp Maine: Rustic Furniture & Accessories, 1860-1940* closing on November 18, only a couple of weeks remain to see the more than 200 rustic pieces representing some of the finest in or out of any museum. The exhibition—with its colorful array of bent twig chairs, vintage signage, fly fishing lures and camp paintings—has enjoyed record attendance and is currently showcased in the November 2006 issue of *Architectural Digest*, the leading international magazine of interior design.

As a special, final tie-in with the exhibition, the Museum is pleased to announce “Flannel and Blaze Days.” Visitors coming to the Museum during regular open hours from October 31 through November 11 wearing red flannel or hunter’s blaze orange will automatically be entered into a drawing to win a commemorative camp poster. The image is a 1983 classic camp print by artist L. W. Duke and comes professionally mounted with archival backing. Additional raffle tickets may be purchased for \$1 apiece.
