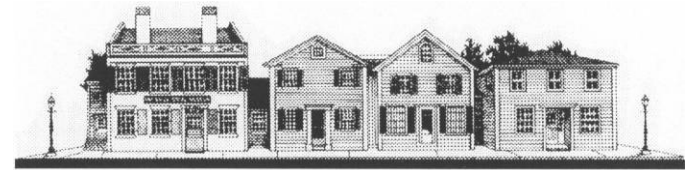

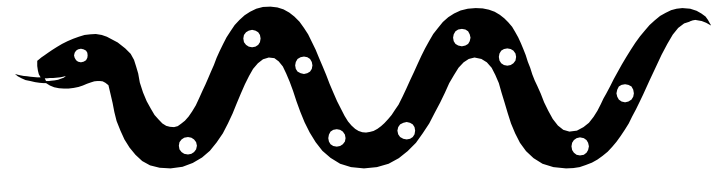

What will the day be like?

Each of the day's activities tie in with the Museum's fanciful new exhibition: *Wild Things: Selections from Kate Manko's Collection of American Folk Art Animals*.



You'll begin the day by viewing the nearly 100 carved pieces in the exhibition to serve as your inspiration. You'll then learn to identify the tracks made by various Maine wild animals and create a casting of an animal print as a keepsake. Next, you'll let your imagination run wild in crafting a "stuffed fish." Finally, you'll try your hand at painting an articulated toy snake and fish in the folk art tradition—they might just end up looking similar to ones you saw in the exhibition! Your projects will be displayed at the end of the day for everyone to enjoy. Best of all, you get to take home everything you made as mementos of the day!
