What will our day be like?



We'll be focusing on the shipbuilding heritage
of the Kennebunks through a variety of hands-
on activities. Our day will begin at the Museum
with Captain Rich Woodman—boat builder
and experienced captain of the Schooner
Eleanor—hearing about life in the Kennebunks'
19th-century shipyards and all the types of tools
and people it took to build the vessels that eventually sailed trade
routes spanning the globe.

You'll then set out to create and rig your very own
Kennebunk-built wooden vessel. In our "test pool,"
you'll be able to experiment with your design and the
placement of ballast to create a seaworthy vessel.
You'll then sing traditional sea shanties with a
concertina player, learning the importance that music
played in the early shipyards, at launchings, and at sea.



After lunch, board a special trolley for an afternoon excursion that
will take us to various historical locales associated with
shipbuilding along the Kennebunk River in the 1800s: the sites of
the former Bourne & Kingsbury and Titcomb yards, the Landing,
and the locks. Your day culminates in Kennebunkport with an
authentic trial launching of your vessel into the Kennebunk River
before returning to the Museum. And best of all...you get to take
home your vessel as a keepsake of the day!

What do we need to bring and remember?

Find a family member and be sure to bring along your enthusiasm
and imagination! Don't forget to sign up early so you will get one of
the limited spaces available. Remember to bring your lunch and
arrive on time so the activities can begin promptly—we have a
busy day planned! We look forward to seeing you on September
