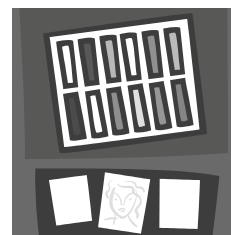
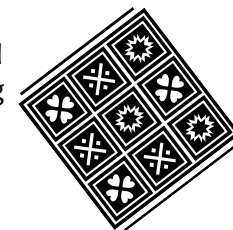
What will we be doing?

Each of the day's activities ties in with the Museum's current and upcoming exhibitions, including: *Quilts from the Collections of the Brick Store Museum*, *Pennies to Ride: The Kennebunks' Turn-of-the-Century Trolleys*, and *For Pastels Only*.



You'll begin the morning with a quick trip through the Museum's displays to serve as your inspiration. You'll then dive right in to assembling a trolley diorama set against vintage scenes of the Kennebunks. Based upon maps and actual newspapers, you'll even create an itinerary and an advertisement as if you were a trolley company executive in 1905.

Next up is an introduction to quilting, with a chance to explore classic patterns, symbolism and styles. You'll then have an opportunity to re-create the timeless "log cabin" design in fabric as a keepsake—and even work a sewing machine!



Then, it's time to try your hand at soft pastels, in the tradition of the amazing artists whose work will be hanging at the Museum as part of the upcoming 11th annual juried international show. Apply the "rule of thirds" in composition, and learn basic techniques like "hatching," "blending" and "scumbling."

At the end of the day, your projects will be placed on view for everyone to enjoy. Best of all, you'll get to take home everything you made as mementos of the day!

What do I need to remember?

Don't forget to sign up early and to bring along your enthusiasm and creativity. Remember to pack your lunch and arrive on time at 9:45 a.m. so we can begin promptly at 10AM—we have a busy day planned! We look forward to seeing you on February 17, 2010.
