# Spend a day at The Brick Store Museum on a “Vintage Vacation!”

**A one-day, fun day at The Brick Store Museum,  
117 Main Street, Kennebunk (985-4802)**

Saturday, July 19, 2008, 8:45 AM - 3:00 PM\*  
\*Activities end at 2:30 PM so that families and the  
general public can view the campers’ projects on  
display and tour the museum’s exhibitions.

For children ages 8 to 13.

## What will the day be like?

Each of the day’s activities ties in with one of the Museum’s current  
exhibitions: *Fanfare for Summer*, *Mailed from Maine*, and *Living Little:  
A Selection of Dollhouses and Architectural Models*.

You’ll begin the morning with a quick trip through each of the displays  
to serve as your inspiration. You’ll then dive right  
into the world of handheld fans, used by men,  
women and children alike as breeze makers,  
advertising gimmicks and souvenirs, or fashion  
accessories. Based on your newfound knowledge,  
you’ll decorate a fan in your own unique style and  
even have a chance to  
literally try your hand  
with it as a secret signaler!



Next up is a look at postcards, and you’ll  
have an opportunity to create an oversized  
one in a vintage style using classic images of  
the Kennebunks of yesteryear  
from the Museum’s collections.



Then, it’s make-your-own museum! After being wowed  
by the tiny church, store, and homes in the Museum’s  
*Living Little* exhibition, you’ll set out to design and outfit  
a museum...in miniature! What will yours feature? Natural history?  
Modern art? Let your imagination go and see how “found objects” can  
take on new looks and uses in a mini environment.

At the end of the day, your projects will be placed on view for  
everyone to enjoy. Best of all, you’ll get to take home everything you  
made as mementos of the day!
